As We Gather:

The Old Testament prophets (and Jesus) called God's people to do justice. In society, we hear cries for justice. The challenge in our culture is to define what we mean by this word, *justice*. In the bible, Christians have an ancient, rich, strong, and attractive understanding that differs from the secular alternatives without ignoring their concerns. Today, we will look at the concept of justice as we explore the book of Amos.
