

Confession and Absolution

Pastor: Let us confess our sins to God, and ask his forgiveness.

People: Almighty God, even though we should shine with Jesus'

light, we often become lost in the shadows of sin. We turn away from your Word and your will to listen to the temptations of the world around us. Instead of seeking to help and serve others, we pay more attention to our own sinful de-

sires. Have mercy on us and forgive our sins.

Pastor: God loved the world and sent his Son to be our Savior. Jesus died

> and rose from death for us, and our sins are washed away in his blood. I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

People: Jesus, Light of the World, shine in and through us!


¹⁴And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Sermon

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

Pastor: The peace of the Lord be with you always.






