Voters' Meeting Update: At the voters meeting this past Sunday, the congregation approved the recommendation to call a candidate from one of our seminaries to serve as our next pastor. The appropriate paperwork has been submitted to the district and we will await a response. We should know by the beginning of April if we will be welcoming a graduate pastor who would start sometime this summer. In the meantime, the board approved the formation of a call committee to begin the process of calling a pastor from the field (already serving a congregation). The committee will have initial meetings in February and March. If we do not receive a seminary candidate, we should be in a position to interview and evaluate candidates and issue a call in late spring or early summer.
