THE GOOD NEWS ACCORDING TO PASTOR MARK

We worship one God in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance. (Athanasian Creed)

The first Sunday after Pentecost is celebrated in many churches as Trinity Sunday. It is unique in the church calendar because it celebrates a doctrine instead of a historical event. If you have ever had Jehovah's Witnesses stop by your front door, you know that one of the common complaints against the teaching of the Trinity is that the word, *Trinity*, is not in the bible.

The Christian church confesses the Trinity because it is revealed to us in Scripture. Throughout the Old Testament, God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Spirit. Occasionally all three persons appear in the same text (Isaiah 42:1). More often, it is hinted. Let us make man in *our* image (Genesis1:26). In the New Testament, we see a clear vision of the Son. And the Son sends his church in the name of the triune God. Baptize in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Paul and the other epistle writers confess the Trinity in their letters to the early church.

The early church struggled with the teaching. Some believed that Jesus and the Spirit were inferior to the Father. Others believed that there was one God who appeared in different modes (much like an actor in a play might appear in different roles). Eventually the conflict was clarified in the council of Nicea where the church came to an agreement concerning the relationship of the persons of the

Godhead. The Father was uncreated, the source of all things. The Son was begotten, not created and one substance with the Father. The Spirit proceeds from the Father. As we experience the Trinity, we often see



God as the Creator, the Son as the Redeemer, and the Spirit as the Sanctifier. With these carefully constructed ideas, the understanding of God as Three-in-one became the confession of the church.

The Trinity is difficult to understand, yet God is often difficult to comprehend. We receive this teaching and rejoice in it. The good news in the Trinity is that through this teaching God makes himself known as a God who loves us and desires eternal fellowship with us. He sends his Son so that we might know him as the one who will redeem his people. His Spirit works through the power of the Word to draw people to Jesus. Through faith, we are part of the people of God and we give glory to the Triune God! Trinity Sunday is June 12 this year. We welcome a guest speaker, Rev. Dr. Robert Kasper from the Michigan District. Plan to join us in worship as we give thanks to God for his revelation to us.
