Every day you see one more card

Noted American songwriter (and lousy theologian) Tom Petty laments the difficulty of waiting. We can sympathize with the feeling. We don't like to wait. When lines are long or the doctor hasn't called with the test results, we often become concerned, impatient, or even angry.

Psalm 130:5 encourages us to wait; I wait for the Lord and in his word I put my hope.

The bible is full of people who are waiting. Adam and Eve are waiting for a child who will deliver them from sin and death. The children of Israel wait for 40 years as they wander in the wilderness. Simeon, an old man, goes every day to temple, waiting for the consolation of Israel. All of these people and millions more put their hope and trust in God's Word and His promise. And God came through for them.

Advent is a season of waiting. While the world around is preparing for holiday celebrations, the Christian church is mindful of Christ. We do look forward to the celebration of Jesus' birth. Around this time of year, we may get the urge to make sweets and spoil our family. Why not? It's our job, right? Whether we're grandparents, godparents, or other relatives, we want to see our family thriving in happiness. Part of the joy of the holiday season goes well beyond sweets and smiles. - * Light Advent candles even when guests are present. Invite them to join you in devotions.
- Give gifts that support faith, such as Bibles, devotion books, and prayer books.
- Practice forgiveness and grace during stressful holiday events.
- Read Luke 2 with the whole family.
- Offer rides to family members who may need extra motivation to get to church.

- * Take pictures of your family in church and share with others.
- Connect with others at church. Help them to feel part of your church family.
- Call someone and do Christmas caroling over the phone.
- * Donate money, time, or things to someone in need. Pray for them as you serve.
- * Watch for the lonely and the sad-—at Christmas dinner, at church, at the store. Pray for them and let them know you care.
- * Sing Happy Birthday to Jesus with the little ones. Make birthday cupcakes!

Make sure you take care of yourself too. This busy holiday season can easily distract us from what is important. Advent is the perfect time to set some new habits or double down on the some that

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need reinforcing. How is your prayer life? Your Bible reading? Do you have a set time or does it somehow escape you on most days? Choose to be more intentional this Advent season. As you light a candle and say a prayer, realize you can keep it very simple. Or, go ahead and dig out that Advent wreath with the candles. Find an Advent resource and vow to read your Bible for ten minutes every morning and every night. Do what works for you and what you need. The housework can wait a few minutes. The Christmas cookies will still get decorated. Sit at the feet of Jesus at least once a day. Spend time with him. He came to earth for you!

Heavenly Father, you sent your Son to live among us and give us the hope of eternal life. As your Spirit guides us this Advent and Christmas season, grow our faith and help us support the faith of those around us. Please give the gift of faith to those who do not yet trust in you. Show us how to help them know you more. Give us the compassion and strength to speak up and have the right words to show and share our faith. Amen.


STEPHEN MINISTERS ARE CARE-GIVERS,...
